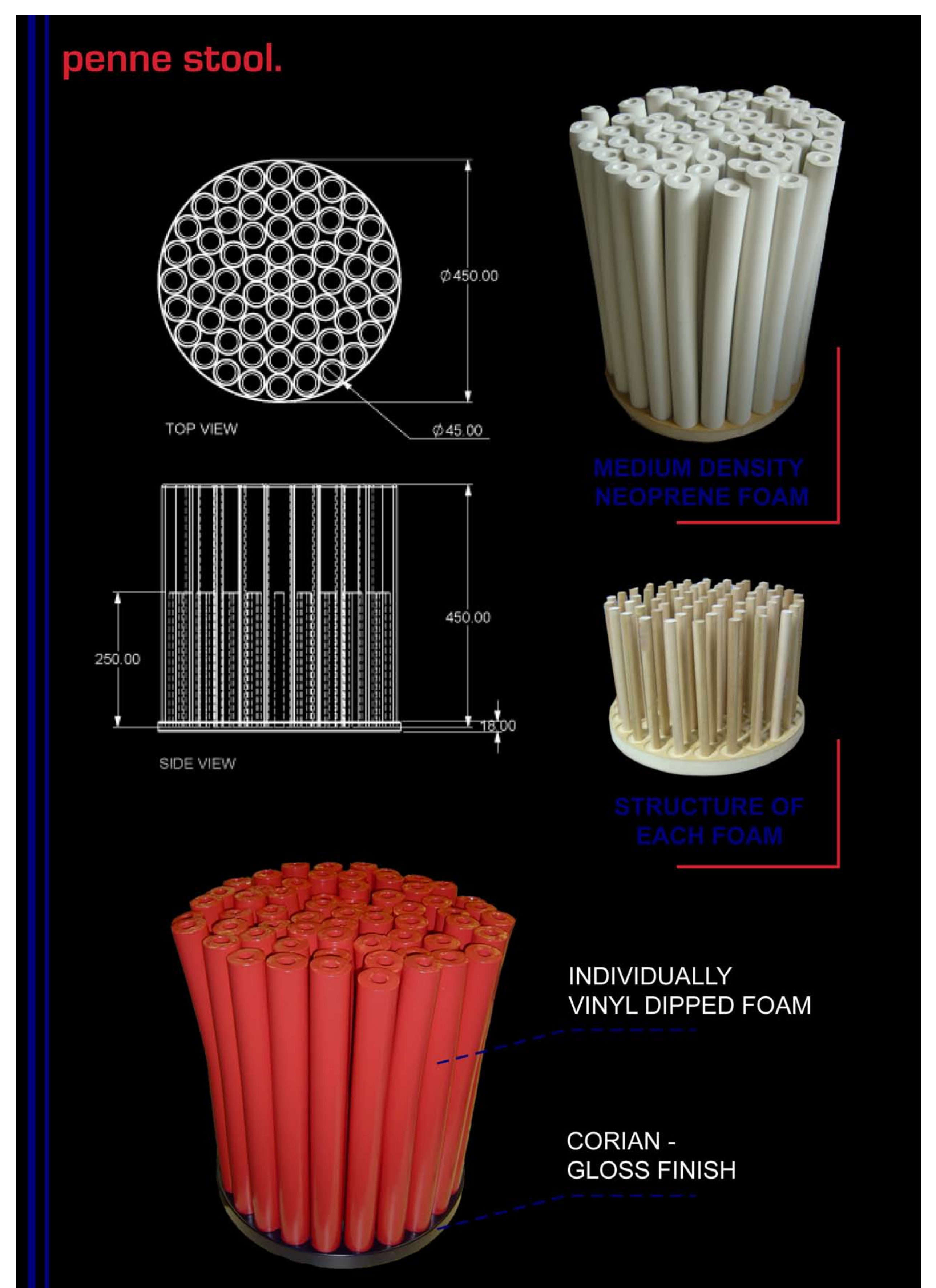




Yustina's designs reflect an adventurous yet refined aesthetic that is unique, playful and full of character. The Penne Stool encourages interaction between the user and the stool, through movement and deflection. Penne is made from a Corian base and sixty one pieces of vinyl dipped neoprene tubes which provide flexible support and which, when the stool is no longer in use, revert back to their original form. The Drool Stool, seating and side table, was inspired by the organic lines of nature. Composed of layers of plywood with veneer top sheets Drool can be finished in a number of different surfaces.

Yustina Soebiantoro graduated in from the Industrial Design program, at RMIT in 2007. In her final year, she had the chance to produce a piece that was successfully exhibited in Salone Satellite in Milan, Italy in 2008. Designing soft goods has always been her interest, and so, she is now has settled down in Singapore and working full time as an industrial designer for a sporting goods company.
